DON'T make yourself a Victim!

Decrease your risk for Shoplifting, Robbery, Burglary & Theft

- * Get FREE SFSafe.org Business Watch Training for you and your Employees. 415-673-SAFE.
- * Burglars often case a store prior to the incident. SF SAFE can train you to recognize casing.
- * Keep High End Goods where you can see them.
- * Know your Rights. You do NOT have to serve someone if you don't want to.
- * Be extra cautious around closing time.
- * Join a Neighborhood Watch. Keep each other informed about activities in your area.
- * Install Close Circuit TV (CCTV). Have the police check your system for free to ensure an appropriate set-up. CCTV can prevent incidents and is extremely important if one occurs.
- * DO NOT use Dummy Cameras! They open up the possibility for lawsuits!

Dealing with Graffiti & Vandalism

- * Immediately painting over graffiti discourages repeat offenders
- * Record your cost for repair. A cost above \$450 could result in a felony.
- * Tell your neighbors! The HVNA Public Safety meeting is a great time to discuss incidents.
- * Use cameras to capture graffiti & vandalism. Be sure the cameras are weather-proof.
- * Consider signing up for the Department of Public Works (DPW, 311) street mural program. The program creates murals to deter graffiti and is looking for new opportunities.
- * Use city resources: The DPW (311) does graffiti removal within 48 hours. Its priority is to remove Gang & Hate Graffiti. In addition, the DPW has FREE supplies for cleaning up Graffiti on public property.

Dealing with Homeless-related Issues

- * Pay attention and report issues! If you don't report the issue, nothing will happen. Businesses should use the police non-emergency number. Be detailed in your report.
- * Homelessness is not a crime. Unless the homeless person has outstanding warrants, reporting an issue will only result in much-needed help for that person.
- * "No Trespassing" signs (valid for 6 months) are available at your local police station.
- * The SF Homeless Outreach Team can provide assistance. See contact info above-right.
- * Discarded needles are a serious public health risk. For Needle Pickup & Exchange, call 311.
- * The City has two or more Police Officers per District Station for Homeless-related issues.
- * DPW (311) can be called to remove unattended belongings.

Deterring and Dealing with Fraud

- * Again, get FREE SFSafe.org Business Watch Training for you and your Employees.
- * For businesses having bad check issues, call the District Attorney (DA) 551-9503.
- * Educate yourself about counterfeit bills at www.secretservice.gov.

What to do if you are Robbed?

If you are robbed, try to stay calm and cooperate. Try to remember a detailed suspect description.

- * Call 9-1-1 afterwards on a land line or on your cell phone.
- * 9-1-1 for Emergencies; (415) 553-0123 for Non-Emergencies.
- * If English is not your first language, inform the operator what language to speak.
