The Hayes Valley merchants have organized the annual Block Party, happening on Friday, Dec. 4th, 6-9 pm. It's a wonderful way to see our merchants and celebrate the festive mood. HVNA supports activities that bring the community together, and this block party for over 20 years continues to showcase the meaning of community through mostly local businesses. Our merchants have remained focused on providing interesting and often unique products and services. "Support Your Community", a silent auction fundraiser, benefiting the Hayes Valley Neighborhood Association, will be open 6-8 pm on Dec 4th near Patricia's Green. Organized by board member Bob Barnwell, the auction focuses on our local merchants while also providing funds to support HVNA's many community activities such as the Food Box program for neighbors in need.

The PROXY PopUp Gallery, now open near Patricia's Green and curated by A.C.E. co-chair Madeline Behrens-Brigham and new co-chair P.k. Cummings, will feature local artists' work for sale (see separate article in the Voice). An addition this year is the Haight Street Art Center, a community-serving art center, dedicated to the art of print-making, which is sharing the gallery space at PROXY. The Art Center will offer recognizable prints and new artists' work as well. This partnership is the beginning of a long-term relationship between local artists in our community and the Haight Street Art Center that will open later in 2016 on Haight Street between Buchanan and Laguna. The Popup Gallery will be an exciting activity across the street from Patricia's Green.

Explore Hayes Valley and see the changes and additions here. Enjoy the holidays and welcome the New Year by taking the time to introduce yourself and meet your neighbors. Promise yourself that you'll support the artwork that is here and expanding. There is much more creative activity to come in 2016!

SUZY LOFTUS AT DECEMBER 7 PUBLIC SAFETY MEETING



ne of our favorite city officials in Hayes Valley is Suzy Loftus. Not only has she and her family lived in Hayes Valley but for several years she was the Assistant District Attorney assigned to Northern Police Station which oversees our area. Suzy has a special place in her heart for the people of Hayes Valley and their public safety concerns. Suzy is now President of the San Francisco Police Commission and was at the December 7 Public Safety Meeting and talked about the role the Police Commission plays in public safety.

What is the San Francisco Police Commission? This is the policy making board that oversees the San Francisco Police Department. The Police Commission holds hearings every week and once a month holds the hearing in the community which rotates among each Police District. The September 16, 2015 community hearing was held at the Korean American Center in Hayes Valley. There are seven members of the San Francisco Police Commission with 4 appointed by the mayor with Board of Supervisors approval and the other 3 are appointed by the Board of Supervisors. They serve 4 year terms with some of the current members having served several consecutive terms. Suzy Loftus was appointed by Mayor Ed Lee and was unanimously approved by the Board of Supervisors.

The Police Commission establishes the policies for the many activities of the Police Department. An example of this is the Police Commission's current discussion of police wearing body cameras. There are other cities in the country that have police body cameras and there is a big call for San Francisco to start the practice. But it is not a simple issue. There will be many rules and regulations regarding body cameras and they will be written by the Police Commission. A complicated question is whether the police should be allowed to see the body camera footage prior to filing their police report. There are strong feelings on both sides of this one issue among the many issues regarding police wearing body cameras. The Police Commission will look at the way other cities use body cameras and they will write the many pages of rules if they approve body cameras. The Board of Supervisors will then have the final approval of the new rules and regulations. This is what happens for the many policies regarding the Police Department and this is the important role the Police Commission plays in public safety.

We are happy that Suzy Loftus is the leader of the San Francisco Police Commission and we were glad to hear from her on December 7 about her public safety concerns for Hayes Valley.

Holiday Food Box Giveaway in Hayes Valley and Western Addition

In December, Mo'MAGIC will organize a Holiday Food Box giveaway that will benefit Beacon Center at John Muir Elementary School, Hayes Valley Apartments and the Boys and Girls Club/ Don Fisher Clubhouse in Hayes Valley and eight Western Addition locations. Each FoodBox will contain a 10-12 pound turkey and fresh produce.

On December 17, 2015- once the food boxes have been stuffed and organized by volunteers, police officers from the Northern Police Station will make deliveries to the nominated families at the various Hayes Valley and Western Addition housing complexes. Community partners, such as the Boys and Girls Club, will also serves as drop off points for additional community members. Families are nominated by the managers from the housing complexes.

Kaiser Permanente and Bi-Rite Markets have been major supporters of this community program. Kaiser has donated money to cover the costs of the turkeys and will provide volunteers to help with stuffing the food boxes; Bi-Rite is donating all the fresh produce, organizing the turkey order and offering their staff as volunteers. Money has also been pledged by Hayes Valley Neighborhood Association, Lee Walkup, the law offices of Shute, Mihaly & Weinberger LLP and the San Francisco Federal Credit Union.

The Holiday Food Box giveaway is an example of how Mo'MAGIC, Kaiser Permanente, Bi-Rite Markets and individual contributors come together to make the Holiday Season a great time for families in the Hayes Valley and Western Addition communities.

We are actively looking for volunteers and accepting donations. Please contact us if you would like to participate in preparing Parcel O.





Local Voices

Respect. This word has great meaning in Hayes Valley. Respect for those who have endured difficult times here. Respect for those who had a vision for a new neighborhood. Respect for the decisions that were made to create a neighborhood from under the shadow of a towering, 40-foot double-deck freeway. And now a new type of respect...

Accelerating housing prices and rents make living here more exclusive. HVNA's mission is an inclusive mission, embracing all residents. So, when longtime residents are forced to leave, we are seeing lack of respect, in particular the real estate agents and investors who see a profit to be made, not the development of a community.

Most recently, AT&T filmed a commercial in our neighborhood, receiving permission to temporarily to remove street parking to park the filmmakers' equipment. However, a food truck, brought in exclusively for the film crew, created an unhappy environment where neighbors couldn't park their own cars and watched the film crew eat at a food truck, rather than enjoying the many local restaurants. And then there was the 400 block of Oak Street...real estate agents, selling 2 flats in a historic, intact Victorian home that had been gutted of its history, received permission to temporarily remove street parking to provide valet parking for those wealthy enough to afford the prices. No respect for the neighbors who live here.

No one could have imagined 25 years ago what is occurring today in Hayes Valley. The economic boom has especially impacted our neighborhood, even as the Market/Octavia Better Neighborhood Plan is being implemented. However, as property values increase and a different group of neighbors move in, the character of this neighborhood is to know your neighbors. Respect for your neighbors is very important here. Make eye contact and say hello. Introduce yourself and get know someone who may be different than you. It will be an enriching experience.
